Funeral Mass for Mrs. Bernadette L. Sparkes, 79, who ran the Oakley Senior Citizens Center for 17 years, will be at 10:30 a.m. tomorrow at Christ the King Church.

Mrs. Sparkes, of 3575 Kroger Avenue, Mt. Lookout, died Friday at Woodside Manor Nursing Home, Kenwood.

For the past 16 years, she has lived with her sister at Scarlet Oaks Manor.

Miss Franz also is survived by a nephew, Fred Franz, and two great-nephews, Fred Franz Jr., and David Franz, all of Dayton, Ohio.
